	The Minutes of the meeting of Braintree Local Highways Panel held on 3rd October 2022 were approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.	
4.	Matters Arising from the Minutes of the Meeting Held on 3rd October 2022:	
	Minute 6 - 'Schemes Awaiting Funding'	
	Reference was made to five action points which had been recorded in the Minutes of the Panel's last meeting and the following updates were provided for each of them:-	
	Speed Surveys Action: - Dan Maclean, Essex Highways, had been requested to circulate to the Members of the Panel a copy of a document explaining how Essex Highways assesses speed limits. Update: It was reported that unfortunately there had been a delay, but that the guidance document would be circulated in the near future.	
	'Tru-Cam' Automated Speed Checking Device Action: - Dan Maclean, Essex Highways, had been requested to circulate details of the 'Tru-Cam' automated speed checking device and its cost to the Members of the Panel. Update: - It was reported that a meeting had taken place between Essex County Council's Cabinet Member for Highways and Transportation and the Chairmen of North Essex Parking Partnership and South Essex Parking Partnership regarding this matter and it was hoped that an update would be available at the end of January 2023.	
	Possible Introduction of 20mph Speed Limit Zones Across Essex Action: - Dan Maclean, Essex Highways, had been requested to circulate to Members of the Panel a copy of an article published	



in The Times newspaper on 30th September 2022 regarding the experience of other towns and cities across the Country where a 20mph speed limit had been introduced.

<u>Update</u>: - The article had been circulated on 20th October 2022.

Overgrown Vegetation Along Rayne Road, Braintree
Action: - Dan Maclean, Essex Highways, had been requested to investigate if the cutting back of overgrown vegetation along Rayne Road (between Rayne village and Springwood Drive), Braintree may be assigned to the Highway Rangers Team.

Update: - It was reported that it would not be possible for the Highway Rangers Team to carry out this work and the issue would be passed to the Essex Maintenance Team. In discussing this matter, reference was made to a proposal that Essex County Council should cease funding the Highway Rangers Team with effect from 1st April 2023. It was proposed that the Rangers would continue to be employed by Braintree District Council carrying out related duties, but they would not do work which was a function of Essex County Council.

<u>Minute 7 - 'Any Other Business' – 'Damaged and Outdated</u> <u>Directional Signs'</u>

At the last meeting of the Panel, reference had been made to a number of road signs across the District which were damaged, obscured, or out of date and which reflected poorly on the image of the area, particularly on entry to and exit from the District.

Dan Maclean, Essex Highways, had been requested to investigate if a proactive approach towards the replacement and maintenance of road signs in the Braintree District might be implemented and how a sum of approximately £100,000 allocated by Braintree District Council for such work in Braintree town might be utilised.

It was reported that a joint meeting between Essex County Council and Braintree District Council would be taking place soon to discuss this matter. Dan Maclean undertook to contact Alan Lindsey of Essex Highways to obtain the details.

5. Funded Schemes 2022/23:

Consideration was given to a report on the Panel's Funded Schemes for 2022/23, which had been recommended for approval. The report provided an update on the current position of all schemes in the 2022/23 programme of work.

Members of the Panel were reminded that funding of £407,600 had originally been allocated to Braintree Local Highways Panel



for the year 2022/23. Subsequently, further sums of £100,000 in 2021/22 and £200,000 in 2022/23 had been allocated, together with a sum of £177,594 following the re-profiling of schemes in 2021/22. It was reported that £656,000 of the Panel's budget had been allocated to various schemes within the programme of work and that £59,612 had been allocated specifically to casualty reduction schemes. This meant that a total of £169,582 was available for expenditure in 2022/23.

In an update to the report, Members of the Panel were advised that the allocation of £200,000 in 2022/23 might not be available as Essex County Council was considering if this could be identified as a saving when setting the budget for 2023/24. No decision had been made to date. If supported, the proposal would result in the Panel's budget being overspent by approximately £30,500, but it would still be possible to deliver all the schemes in the 2022/23 programme.

In discussing this Item, it was noted that the report referred to the estimated completion time for the following schemes as 'Quarter 3'. It was agreed that Kandice Louis and Dan Maclean, Essex Highways would clarify if the report should refer to 'Quarter 4' instead and amend the report if required.
