# **Executive Summary:**

This is a short summary report to provide Members with an update on the likely Work Programme for this Committee. The likely Work Programme follows conversations with the Chairman of the Committee, discussions with the Chairman of the other scrutiny groups and areas for future exploration identified by Members at the previous meeting of the Partnership Development Group on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2019.

#### Scheduled Work:

This Committee will routinely receive the annual report of the Braintree District Community Safety Partnership. This was received at the last meeting on the 21<sup>st</sup> August 2019 so will next feature in mid-2020.

The key themes for the Committee are scheduled to be:

# **Leisure Provision Across the District - Access to Sport**

- This will focus on the overall pattern of sport and leisure opportunity and the partnership approach to supporting access for residents to sport.
- This will look at the Council's role and that of our delivery partners.

<u>Update: Meeting on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2019</u> – Members received a presentation from Joby Humm, Leisure, Health and Heritage Manager, on the picture of sports availability within the District, an overview of the partnerships there are that support sports groups, and the involvement that the Council had directly through Fusion Lifestyle.

Members identified a number of different research avenues from the presentation for further exploration within the scope of the Scrutiny Review, as well as a number of potential invitees to upcoming meetings. The key areas identified for future exploration included:-

- Active Braintree Foundation Members to examine further the role of Active Braintree and how it supports partners.
- Section 106/CIL/Local Plan Planning Officers to attend and advise Members on potential opportunities in this subject area.
- Public Open Spaces Register Further exploration as to what is available and possible attendance by Officers to inform Members on this subject area.
- Invite to Paige Frost, Teen Ambassador ior Fusion, to speak to Members/ provide a briefing note to inform Committee of her work in relation to Friday Night Live.
- Invite to Rayne Parish Council regarding leisure provision.
- Plotting data regarding leisure provision on GIS system.

<u>Fusion Lifestyle Annual Report to Cabinet</u> – Cabinet will likely receive the annual report and presentation from Fusion Lifestyle at the additional meeting of Cabinet on 18th December 2019. Members will be notified of the details closer to this time.

Other work: Research is also being undertaken by officers to refine detail in relation to the topics below for future scrutiny by the Committee.

# **Delivering Homes for those with additional needs:**

- Looking at the needs of those in the district with additional housing need, particularly those with additional physical and mental health needs.
- This will include understanding the overall picture of need, and the role of the Council in delivery, as well as the partnerships which facilitate and meet this need
- The review will also look at the partnerships engaged with adapting existing housing for those with specific or changing needs.

#### Food and Schools:

 Considering the partnerships which the Council has which impact on the provision of food within schools and the wider partnership approach to ensuring appropriate food provision for all sectors of society.
