## **Executive Summary:**

#### 2. Details

2.1 An application was received and validated from Leanne Davies t/a Panners Coffee Bar on 29 June 2017 for a variation of a premises licence at Panners Coffee Bar, Panners Parade, Priory Lane, Great Notley (Appendix 1). The application was deemed valid on 29 June 2017 and the consultation started.

The purpose of the variation application is to:

Sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises:

Monday to Sunday 12:00 to 23:00

### **Provision of regulated entertainment**

**Live Music – Indoors** 

Monday to Saturday 19:00 to 23:00 Sunday 14:00 to 21:00

2.2 If the premises is authorised for the sale of alcohol for consumption on those premises, regulated entertainment hours requested will no longer require to be licensed.

- This will mean that if the audience does not exceed 500, live and recorded music between 08:00 and 23:00 would not require a licence.
- 2.3 In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, a notice was displayed on the premises for a period of no less than 28 days.
- 2.4 Within the operating schedule attached to this application, the applicant has described a number of steps which she intends to take to promote the four licensing objectives; these will become conditions of the licence if granted.

### 3. Representations

- 3.1 The Section 182 Guidance for the Licensing Act 2003 states that relevant representations can be made in opposition to, or in support of, an application and can be made by any individual, body, or business that has grounds to do so.
- 3.2 Following the 28 day consultation under the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Authority received eight representations from interested parties (Appendix 2). These are split into six opposing the application and two supporting the application.

## 4. History

- 4.1 The premises currently benefits from a premises licence which was first issued in May 2015 after the application was determined at a meeting of the Licensing Sub-Committee.
- 4.2 On 10 November 2016 the premises licence was transferred to the existing holder, Leanne Davies t/a Panners Coffee Bar.

The Parish Council considered the above licensing application at the meeting held on 24<sup>th</sup> July 2017 and would like to make the following representations in relation to the issue –

- 1. The Parish Council has noted that there are differing views from residents with some opposing the application and others who are in favour.
- 2. The Parish Council has noted that within the application form the applicant has failed to deal with the questions relating to the four licensing objectives thus for the Parish Council to make more substantive comments and for the application to be properly considered it needs to be known what steps she would take to satisfy those objectives.
- 3. The application request that the licensing hours for music are from 7pm to 11pm Monday to Saturday and 7pm to 10pm on a Sunday and for an alcohol license from 9am to 11pm Monday to Saturday and to 9pm on a Sunday, yet the narrative of the application asks for extra hours on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. The Parish Council has noted that the coffee shop is in close proximity to a number of residential properties and to effectively comment on this matter the Parish Council would wish there to be clarity in exactly what the applicant is proposing rather than making what seems to be a 'blanket' application.

The Parish Council would be grateful if these comments could be taken into consideration.

I wish to raise an objection to the proposed extension of the permitted hours of the premises licence on the grounds of nuisance, but your website will not allow me to access the application in order to make comment.

I note representations have to be made by 27th July 2017.

I live at the properties to the promises.

The premises was set up as a coffee bar, not a pub which it seems to be moving towards.

We suffer from late night noise nuisance already when the premises is open late, and particularly so in the summer, when windows are open and people congregate outside.

The particular nulsance is from people gathering on the paved area outside of the premises where there are tables, when people leave the premises after closing ether going to their cars and making a lot of noise while they leave (doors slamming, loud voices) or walking past our home talking loudly or shouting.

This is a residential area and many people have young children.

I don't object to the principle of the premises being allowed to open and to host music events, but I think that 23.00 each day for alcohol consumption with 23.00 Monday to Saturday for music and 21.00 on Sunday is too late given the residential setting of the premises and the close proximity of homes.

My suggestion is that a reasonable and sensible compromise given the location of the premises would be 21.00 every day, except Saturday when 22.00 would be reasonable in respect of both alcohol and music. In view of the nuisance already caused, if a compromise isn't possible, I ask that the application is refused.

#### Dear Sir/Madam

I would like to strongly object to the application for variation of premesis licence made by the coffee shop unit 3 on Panners Parade Great Notley.

We live behind the coffee shop and purchased our home from plans fifteen years ago There was never any plans to build a three storey building. We were informed of a single storey craft shop. Then by magic a three storey premesis was erected bringing unwanted noise and traffic.

The coffee shop already makes more noise than I feel is acceptable, late at night already noise and disruption until at least 23.00 the music and noise from customers in the evening is loud and we have to close our windows to bring the volume down. Even then we can still hear it.

I do not have a problem with them selling coffee and cakes during the day but I feel very strongly that they should not only be disallowed to extend their licence but it should be restricted to daytimes only

I have recently invested £150,000 in my property and the prospect of unwanted noise not only makes me not want to live here anymore it will undoubtedly devalue my home. We already have to put up with the deliveries to the coop, the cooking smells from the Chinese restaurant and now the thought of unwanted music and noise. With alcohol comes problems and there will be an unnecessary disruption of a once peaceful neighbourhood. I was only made aware by a concerned neighbour, the application is tucked away in the side alleyway of the premises which I also feel is very underhand, I personally would never walk through the alleyway so potentially would never have been made aware of this infringement of my peace.

I work very long hours and rely on the few hours of sleep I can get, this would certainly affect my quality of life as well as the effect to the resale of my property.

I will be putting this in writing to you.

I wish to raise an objection to the proposed extension of the permitted hours of the premises licence on the grounds of nuisance, but your website will not allow me to access the application in order to make comment.

I note representations have to be made by 27th July 2017.

I live at the premises one of the nearer residential properties to the premises.

The premises was set up as a coffee bar, not a pub which it seems to be moving towards.

We suffer from late night noise nuisance already when the premises is open late, and particularly so in the summer, when windows are open and people congregate outside.

The particular nuisance is from people gathering on the paved area outside of the premises where there are tables, when people leave the premises after closing ether going to their cars and making a lot of noise while they leave (doors slamming, loud voices) or walking past our home talking loudly or shouting.

This is a residential area and many people have young children.

I don't object to the principle of the premises being allowed to open and to host music events, but I think that 23.00 each day for alcohol consumption with 23.00 Monday to Saturday for music and 21.00 on Sunday is too late given the residential setting of the premises and the close proximity of homes.

My suggestion is that a reasonable and sensible compromise given the location of the premises would be 21.00 every day, except Saturday when 22.00 would be reasonable in respect of both alcohol and music. In view of the nuisance already caused, if a compromise isn't possible, I ask that the application is refused.

PANNERS COFFEE BAR - Unit 3, Panners Parade, Great Notice, CM77 7AE

With reference to the above application, we would like to object to the variation.

We feel that the current hours, 12 midday to 10pm are perfectly adequate for alcohol consumption for a coffee bar.

If the alcohol is not served after 10pm then by the time customers leave the premises it is in the region of 10pm to 11pm. If the licence is extended by an hour then this will be between the hours of 11pm to 0.00 am. Particularly as the owners do have the option to apply for the hours to be extended for private functions.

The Coffee Bar is situated in an area which is primarily residential and therefore the residents do need to be protected against excessive noise and disturbance from customers leaving the premises beyond the hours of 10.00pm

The Coffee Bar as it stands is not large enough for a substantial amount of customers and there is a need when busy for people to stand outside and for the doors to be open which then leads to noise and disturbance at a time which is clearly socially unacceptable for nearby residents.

With regard to the provision of live music, can this not be restricted to Friday and Saturday evenings. It does not seem reasonable for live music to be allowed on weekdays. We do not want to be in the position of not being able to open bedroom windows due to the level of noise.

The Coffee Bar serves the community more than adequately with the licencing hours and opening hours already in place. It would be a shame to make changes to the detriment of local residents and the community.

## **Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

#### All supplies of alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

#### Irresponsible drinks promotions

- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise)
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

- (e) Dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability)
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

#### Age verification policy

- 5. (1) The Premises Licence Holder or Club Premises Certificate Holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
    - (a) a holographic mark or
    - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

#### Alcoholic drink measures

- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml
  - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

#### The sale of alcohol below the cost of duty plus VAT

- 7. (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 B11/831 Page 5 of 9 31 16/01938/LAPREM

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

#### P = D + (DXV)

#### Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of the value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(a).
- (3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) (1) Sub paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
  - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.


## Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

# HEARING PROCEDURE FOR PREMISES LICENCES/CLUB PREMISES CERTIFICATES WHERE APPLICANT AND OBJECTORS ARE PRESENT

## 1. Welcome and Introduction

- [1] The Chairman welcomes the people who are present and introduces the Members. He/she will ask the Members to confirm that they have no declarations of interest to declare in respect of the application.
- [2] The Chairman asks the Applicant to introduce himself/herself and then asks the Objectors to introduce himself/herself/themselves.
- [3] The Chairman then confirms that the hearing will be conducted in accordance with this procedure. If any party wishes to rely upon any evidence that has not been disclosed prior to the hearing, they must ask for the Chairman's permission at this point.

# 2. The Applicant's Case

- [1] The Chairman asks the Applicant or his/her representative to present his/her application for a licence.
- [2] The Applicant or his/her representative may then call any witnesses and/or give evidence in support of his/her application.
- [3] The Objector[s] or their spokesperson may then question the Applicant [if he has given evidence] and any witnesses.
- [4] The Chairman or any Member of the Sub-Committee may ask questions of the Applicant and any witnesses.
- [5] If there are any witnesses, the Applicant or his representative will then be given a final opportunity of asking any further questions of the witnesses to clear up any points raised in the earlier questioning.

# 3. The Objector[s] Case

- [1] The Objector[s] will give their reasons for objecting to the application.
- [2] The Objector[s] or their representative will then call any witnesses in support of their objection.
- [3] The Applicant or his representative may then question the Objector[s] [if they have given evidence] and any witnesses.

- [4] The Chairman or any Member of the Sub-Committee may ask questions of the Objector[s] and any witnesses.
- [5] If there are any witnesses, the Objector[s] or their representative will then be given a final opportunity of asking any further questions of the witnesses to clear up any points raised in the earlier questioning.

## 4. Closing Statements

- [1] By or on behalf of the Objectors. The Objectors may summarise any points they wish to make and comment briefly on the Applicant's replies to questions. They cannot introduce new issues.
- [2] By or on behalf of the Applicant. The Applicant or his/her representative may summarise any points they wish to make and comment briefly on the Objector's replies to questions. They cannot introduce new issues.
- [3] The Chairman will then ask the Legal Adviser whether there are any other matters to be raised or resolved before the hearing is adjourned. The Sub-Committee will then retire to a separate room with the Legal Adviser and Member Services Officer to deliberate.
- [4] If the Legal Adviser gives legal advice to Members during the period of adjournment this advice will be repeated in summary form when the hearing reconvenes.

# 5. Decision

- [1] The Chairman will then announce the Sub-Committee's decision and ask the Legal Adviser to read out the details including the reasons.
- [2] Before closing the hearing, the Chairman will notify the Applicant and the Objector[s] of the rights of appeal available to the parties should they disagree with the decision. Such appeal should be made within 21 days of receiving written notification of the Sub-Committee's decision.
